AN ORDINANCE FIXING SALARIES FOR



EXCERPTS FROM THE MINUTES OF A  
[REGULAR OR SPECIAL] MEETING OF THE COMMON COUNCIL  
OF THE CITY OF ROCKPORT

The Common Council of the City of Rockport met in the Council Chambers City Hall, 421 Main Street, on the 16<sup>th</sup> day of August, 2001, at the hour of 7:00 P .m., in [regular ~~or special~~] meeting pursuant to call in accordance with the rules of the Council.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor, Joseph L. Greene, who presided.

On call of the roll the members of the Council were shown to be present or absent as follows:

Mr. John A. Hargis, the City Attorney, was also present at the meeting.

John A. Hargis stated that Ice Miller, attorneys of Indianapolis, employed by the City as bond counsel, had prepared a form of bond ordinance for consideration by the Council in the matter of the financing of the construction of additions and improvements to the sewage works of the City.

John A. Hargis then stated that it would now be in order for the Council to consider said ordinance.

Robert Lindsey then introduced the bond ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance concerning the construction of additions and improvements to the sewage works of the City of Rockport, the issuance of revenue bonds to provide the cost thereof, the collection, segregation and distribution of the revenues of said works, the safeguarding of the interests of the owners of said revenue bonds, other matters connected therewith, including the issuance of notes in anticipation of

bonds, and repealing ordinances inconsistent herewith," and moved that said ordinance be numbered and placed on first reading, and that the same be read by title at this time.

Said motion was seconded by Virgil Adams, and on call of the roll was carried by the following vote:

The ordinance having been numbered 2001-5, and having been read by title, David Koenig moved that the ordinance be read a second time by title and opportunity be given for the offering of amendments. This motion was seconded by Jerald Payne, and on call of the roll was carried by the following vote:

Ayes: 5

Nays: 0

Ordinance No. 2001-5 was then read a second time by title and no amendments were offered. Virgil Adams moved that any applicable local rules be suspended and that unanimous consent of the members present be given for consideration of Ordinance No. 2001-5 on the day or at the meeting at which said ordinance was introduced and for third reading of Ordinance No. 2001-5 at this meeting without further consideration. This motion was seconded by David Koenig, and on call of the roll the vote on said motion was as follows:

Nays: 0

The Presiding Officer stated that the motion for the suspension of the rules and such consideration of Ordinance No. 2001-5 having been carried by unanimous vote of the members present, final action on said ordinance would now be in order. He then directed the Clerk-Treasurer to read said ordinance a third time by title.

Said ordinance having been read a third time by title, David Koenig then moved that the ordinance be adopted as read. This motion was seconded by Jerald Payne, and on call of the roll was carried by the following vote:

The Presiding Officer announced that there being at least two-thirds of the members elect of the Council present at the meeting and the motion for adoption having been carried by a two-thirds vote of all such elected members, Ordinance No. 2001-5 had been duly passed and adopted.

John A. Hargis, City Attorney stated that a form of rate ordinance had been prepared for consideration by the Council in the matter of setting the rates and charges for the use of and service rendered by the sewage works of the City.

John A. Hargis, City Attorney stated that it would now be in order for the Council to consider said ordinance.

David Koenig then introduced the rate ordinance, entitled "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE SCHEDULE OF SEWER RATES AND CHARGES TO BE COLLECTED BY THE CITY OF ROCKPORT FROM THE OWNERS OF PROPERTY SERVED BY THE SEWAGE WORKS

OF THE CITY," and moved that said ordinance be numbered and placed on first reading, and that the same be read in full at this time.

Said motion was seconded by Jerald Payne, and on call of the roll was carried by the following vote:

Ayes: 5 Nays: 0

David Koenig moved that a public hearing on said ordinance be held at a meeting of the Council on September 11, 2001, at the hour of 4:00 p.m.

This motion was seconded by Virgil Adams, and on call of the roll was carried by the following vote:

Ayes: 5 Nays: 0

David Koenig moved that the Clerk-Treasurer, with the advice of counsel, be instructed to publish and mail all notices required by statute pertaining to the hearing on the proposed rate ordinance.

This motion was seconded by James Carl Jones, and on call of the roll was carried by the following vote:


