The Common Council of the City of Rockport met in the Council Chambers City, Hall
421 Main Street, on the 16 <sup>th</sup> day of August, 2001, at the hour of 7:00 p.m., in [regular Rockport, IN 47635
M×SPECIAL] meeting pursuant to call in accordance with the rules of the Council.
The meeting was called to order by Mayor, Joseph L. Greene, who presided.
On call of the roll the members of the Council were shown to be present or absent as follows:
