

**AN ORDINANCE SUPERSEDING ORDINANCE NO. 2011-10, AN ORDINANCE  
IMPOSING PROHIBITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS ON PARKING IN THE  
CITY OF ROCKPORT**

WHEREAS, in 2011 the City of Rockport Common Council passed Ordinance No. 2011-10 imposing prohibitions and restrictions on parking on City streets, and

WHEREAS, a new Ordinance regarding the imposition of prohibitions and restrictions on parking on City streets should be passed and Ordinance No. 2011-10 should be superseded.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Common Council of the City of Rockport, Indiana, as follows:

1. City of Rockport Ordinance No. 2011-10 is hereby rescinded and superseded by this Ordinance.
2. For purposes of this ordinance, "motor vehicle" means a vehicle that is self-propelled and includes, but is not limited to, motorcycles, mopeds, four wheelers, motorized bicycles, and similar conveyances.
3. The City of Rockport shall place official signs that are visible and that impose prohibitions or restrictions on stopping, standing or parking in certain areas under the jurisdiction of the City of Rockport.
4. All owners and operators of motor vehicles shall observe and obey such signs, and a person may not stop, stand or park a motor vehicle in violation of the prohibitions or restrictions.
5. No person shall park any motor vehicle on a street, other than an alley, in such a manner or under such conditions as to leave available less than fifteen (15) feet of width of the roadway from free movement of vehicular traffic.

6. No person shall park, or cause to be parked, any motor vehicle which, in overall dimensions, is more than twenty-one (21) feet long, more than seven (7) feet wide, or more than eight (8) feet high, nor any motor vehicle registered as having a gross vehicle weight of more than 11,000 pounds, on any street for more than sixty (60) minutes per day, except for the purposes of loading or unloading, without written permission from the Board of Public Works and Safety. This provision shall not apply to passenger cars.

7. No person shall park or place any nonmotorized or wheeled device; including, by way of example and not limitation, trailers, wagons, carts, boats, dumpsters, or wheeled or non-wheeled machinery, on any street for more than sixty (60) minutes per day without the written permission of the Board of Public Works and Safety.

8. The Board of Public Works and Safety is authorized to issue permits for parking which would otherwise be in violation of this section. A special parking permit shall issue only if the board determines that the parking will not present a hazard or create an obstruction of traffic.

9. Any person who violates this Ordinance shall be subject to a fine of \$25.00 (Twenty-Five Dollars) for each violation, plus court costs if applicable. Each day that a person is in violation of the terms of this Ordinance shall be considered a separate violation.


10. All ordinances or provisions of ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby rescinded and repealed.


11. All law enforcement officers within the City of Rockport shall have the power and it shall be their duty to enforce the provisions of this Ordinance unless otherwise prevented by State statutes regarding the enforcement of State laws.

12. If any paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase in this Ordinance is declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the remainder of this Ordinance shall not be affected by such declaration and shall remain in full force and effect.


